ENVIRONMENT

In Canada, most oats are sown into a field that has the stubble from the prior year's crop (called no/low tillage). This practice has big environmental benefits, including reduced soil erosion and improved air quality. Recent studies have also shown that oats have one of the best environmental footprints of crops commonly grown in Canada.
