My grandfather bought our original home farm in 1928.

We started growing beets in the 1940s. My dad farmed until 1986 when I took over, making me third generation. My son Ben joined me in 2021, making him the fourth. I graduated from the University of Alberta (U of A) in 1982 with a degree in agriculture. After working for Alberta Agriculture, I returned to the farm. My son Ben has a degree in physics from the University of Lethbridge. My daughter Rebecca has a degree in agriculture from the U of A as well. She works for Rogers sugar and tells us what we are doing wrong. I am the current president of the ASBG board and have served as a director on the board in the past. Sugar beets are one of the reasons I have been able to expand my operation, and one of my favourite memories with sugar beets is when I grew my first crop that was over



30 metric tonnes an acre.
